### **Landowner Invasive Plant Removal Rebate Program**

Thank you for your interest in the Northwest Invasive Plant Council's Landowner Invasive Plant Removal Rebate program and your concern for the spread of alien invasive plants in British Columbia. This program is to aid landowners with the cost of controlling invasive plants on their private land. Qualified applicants may be eligible for a 50% rebate from the NWIPC; the maximum rebate is \$750.00, excluding the cost for contractor travel. Please discuss your options and preferences with the contractor.

You may not qualify for this rebate program if:

- You are already receiving money from any other funding program for invasive plant control on your private land.
- The estimated cost is not within industry standards.
- The Request for Rebate is received after November 15.
- The plant(s) you wish to target are not on our Target Species List

Follow these 4 simple steps to complete the Landowner Rebate Program:

- 1. Check the Target Invasive Plant list (p. 4) to ensure the species you want controlled is/are on the list.
- 2. Hire a certified pesticide applicator with a valid service licence to provide a cost estimate and invasive plant recommendations for you.
  - A list of potential service providers is provided (p. 5) but not limited by the NWIPC with this application.
  - The cost must be within industry standards.
- 3. When the certified pesticide applicator is at your place of residence, complete *Part 1: Application for Assistance* (p. 2). Send it to the NWIPC via mail or email. The applicator may assist you with completing this form.
- 4. Upon acceptance of your application by from the NWIPC and after work is satisfactorily completed, submit *Part 2: Request for Rebate* (p. 3) to the NWIPC.
  - The annual deadline for submitting your Request for Rebate is November 15 of the year in which the treatment was completed.
